This was the start of my education in preparing horses for amateur owners to ride and show. 1970 saw the start of my training stable, Piney Knoll Farm, in Harlan, lowa. With the aid of many of the one night horse shows and support of my father I was able to establish myself as a trainer of young horses and match horses to riders and coach them to the best of their ability. Though saddlebreds were my first love I trained and showed Arabian, Morgans Appaloosas and Quarter horses with much success winning at regional and world championship shows and earning many national points. Besides my training and breeding program I devoted much time and effort to the Iowa Horse Shows Association serving as a director, vice president and president as well as being a project leader of a local horse 4-H club. 1990 saw the closing of my stable in Harlan and venture into other endeavors but always keeping active in the horse business. Judging multi-breed shows and superintendent of the 1993 Iowa State Fair plus helping with Dakota Fall Classic in Sioux Falls SD along with raising foals kept me doing what I loved to do, working with horses and horse people. This year I am back in the saddle, training and showing horse as I have opened PKF Training Center in Omaha NE. and now accepting horses for all phases of training and The highlights of my career were watching my young horses do well and showing. my riders winning blue ribbons.
